



International Scholarships Terms and Conditions 2018

Definition of 'International Student'

For the purposes of this document, an 'International Student' is defined as a self-funded, international-fee-paying student with overseas fee status.

Definition of 'Top-up Course'

For the purposes of this document, a 'Top-up course' is defined as third year entry onto an undergraduate Bachelor degree.

General Terms and Conditions applying to all International Scholarships

1. University of Lincoln International Scholarships take the form of a tuition fee reduction and will only be awarded during the first year of study. No cash alternative is available.
2. University of Lincoln International Scholarships are not transferable and cannot be deferred to an earlier or later start date.
3. University of Lincoln International Scholarships are not valid in conjunction with each other; only one Scholarship per student per course will be applied.
4. Scholarships will only be awarded to International Students who hold an offer of a place from the University of Lincoln and will be applied when International Students become Unconditional Firm and have paid their deposit in full for the relevant academic year.
5. International Students must be classed as a self-funded overseas student for tuition fee purposes. Please note that students who are sponsored by an employer, funding body or government are not eligible to apply for or receive a University of Lincoln International Scholarship.
6. The University reserves the right to withdraw any University of Lincoln International Scholarship at any point and without notice.
7. International Scholarships will automatically be awarded to suitably qualified International Students ([as per the scholarship requirements](#)) except for Ghana, Egypt, India, Nigeria, Thai, Vietnam Merit, Santander International and Academic Excellence Scholarships; International Students must apply separately for the above scholarships.
8. Any International Scholarship decisions made by the University of Lincoln are final.

Additional Terms and Conditions applying to Ghana, Egypt, India, Nigeria, Thai, Vietnam Merit, Santander International and Academic Excellence Scholarships

9. Candidates must already hold a Conditional or Unconditional Offer from the University of Lincoln for an eligible full time Undergraduate or Postgraduate Taught / Masters by Research Programme commencing in 2018.
10. Candidates must complete and submit (before the application closing date) an International Scholarship Application Form if applying for one of the following University of Lincoln International Scholarships:
 - Academic Excellence Scholarship
 - Egypt Scholarship
 - Ghana Scholarship
 - India Scholarship
 - Nigeria Scholarship
 - Santander International Scholarship
 - Thai Scholarship
 - Vietnam Merit Scholarship
11. Ghana, Egypt, India, Nigeria, Thai, Vietnam Merit, Santander International and Academic Excellence Scholarships are competitive and selection is based on the information contained within the Scholarship Application Form. In addition, the applicant's academic and English language profile provided as part of their programme application to the University of Lincoln will also be considered.
12. Applicants will be informed of a scholarship decision within 10 days of the International Scholarship closing date.
13. Applications received after the 4pm (UK time) deadline for the Ghana, Egypt, India, Nigeria, Thai and Vietnam Merit Scholarships will be considered at the next available scholarship deadline / panel meeting. Applications received after the final scholarship deadline will not be considered.
14. Applicants who have been awarded a Ghana, Egypt, India, Nigeria, Thai, Vietnam Merit, Santander International or Academic Excellence Scholarship must choose to accept or decline the scholarship award by the date given on the award confirmation email.
15. Ghana, Egypt, India, Nigeria, Thai, Vietnam Merit and Academic Excellence Scholarship recipients must have accepted their offer and have paid their CAS deposit no later than Friday 27th July 2018. Failure to complete the CAS process before this time may result in the scholarship being withdrawn.
16. University of Lincoln International Scholarship interviews may be offered as an alternative to completing a Ghana, Egypt, India, Nigeria, Thai, Vietnam Merit, or Academic Excellence Scholarship Application Form. Scholarship interviews are offered at the discretion of the Director of International.
17. Where an applicant does not meet the required academic standards for a University of Lincoln International Scholarship award, an additional scholarship interview may be offered to assess the candidate's suitability at the discretion of the Director of International.
18. Candidates must meet the residency requirements ([as per the scholarship requirements](#)) for the International Scholarship they are seeking.

19. Candidates must agree to produce a short written testimonial highlighting their experiences of studying at the University of Lincoln during the first year of their course. This testimonial may be displayed on, (but not limited to), the University of Lincoln website, University of Lincoln social media channels and University of Lincoln print materials for the purposes of advertising, promoting and marketing the University of Lincoln's products and services. The testimonial may also be shared with the University of Lincoln's approved

Additional Terms and Conditions applying to International Alumni Scholarships

20. The International Student must have previously successfully completed an Undergraduate, Postgraduate Taught or Postgraduate Research course at the University of Lincoln.
21. The International Student must not be entering the University via a partner institution or on a pathway course such as (but not limited to) International Foundation Year, International Year One or Pre-Masters course.
22. The International Student must be enrolled on a full degree course; students enrolling on courses leading to Higher Education Certificate, Higher Education Diploma, Postgraduate Taught Certificate or Postgraduate Taught Diploma qualifications will not be eligible.

Additional Terms and Conditions applying to Santander International Scholarships

23. To be eligible for the scholarship, International Students must be domiciled in the countries covered by the Santander Universities Global Division scheme which includes: Argentina, Brazil, Chile, China, Colombia, Ghana, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Qatar, Russia, Singapore, United Arab Emirates, Uruguay, and the USA.
24. The scholarship is only applicable to International Students joining the first year of a University of Lincoln Undergraduate or Postgraduate Taught Course.
25. Candidates must already hold a Conditional or Unconditional Offer from the University of Lincoln for an eligible full time Undergraduate or Postgraduate Taught / Masters by Research Programme commencing in 2018.
26. Candidates must complete and submit a Santander International Scholarship Application Form no later than 4pm (UK time) on Friday 1 June 2018. Applications received after this deadline will not be considered.
27. The scholarships will be awarded for one year only.
28. The Santander International Scholarships will be awarded to International Students in the first instance on the basis of academic performance. This will take account of grade point averages and (where relevant) portfolios of work.
29. Santander International Scholarship awards cannot be deferred to subsequent intakes.
30. Scholarship recipients will be requested to take part in promotional activity for the University of Lincoln and / or Santander, and the university reserves the right to use the names of scholarship award winners, their photographs and audio and/or visual recordings of them in publicity and marketing materials.

31. The scholarship is exclusively for the International Student selected to receive it and is neither transferable nor exchangeable.
32. By accepting the scholarship, International Students agree to accept the full terms, conditions and rules of the scholarship and agree to abide by the University rules and any requirements and / or proceedings issued by the University of Lincoln in regard to the scholarship.

Additional Terms and Conditions applying to Global Undergraduate Top-Up Scholarships

33. The International Student must be enrolled onto the final year of a University of Lincoln Undergraduate Course of study on the University's student information system. The International Student must have entered the final year of the course directly in order to be eligible.
