University of Lincoln International Scholarships

Terms and Conditions – 2026/27 Academic Year

The terms and conditions set out in this document relate to the awarding of University of Lincoln International Scholarships in respect of the 2026/27 academic year.

For the purposes of this document, the following definitions shall apply:

Definition of ‘Programme of Study’:

A University of Lincoln;

- Undergraduate Programme
- Postgraduate Taught Programme
- Postgraduate Research Programme

Definition of ‘Country or Regional Scholarships’:

The following University of Lincoln International Scholarships will collectively be referred to as ‘Country or Regional Scholarships’;

- Africa Scholarship
- Canada Scholarship
- European Union/EEA Scholarship
- South Asia Scholarship
- South East Asia Scholarship
- Turkey Scholarship

General Terms and Conditions applicable to all University of Lincoln International Scholarships

Eligibility

- 1.1. To be eligible to receive a University of Lincoln International Scholarship, students must have an offer of a place on a Programme of Study which begins in September 2026, or January 2027, unless otherwise stated.
- 1.2. Students must be classified for tuition fee purposes as an overseas fee payer on the University's Student Information System, to be eligible to receive a University of Lincoln International Scholarship.
- 1.3. University of Lincoln International Scholarships will only be awarded to students who have an offer of a place on a full-time Programme of Study at a University of Lincoln campus within the UK.
- 1.4. Students will automatically be considered for a University of Lincoln International Scholarship after they have submitted their application to study at the University. The exception to this is the Global Leaders Scholarship and the Partner Scholarship; students who wish to be considered for these scholarships must submit the relevant application form prior to the applicable deadlines specified in clause 12.3 and clause 14.3.
- 1.5. Students must complete the domicile section in their application to study at the University of Lincoln, to be eligible to be considered for a University of Lincoln International Scholarship.
- 1.6. University of Lincoln International Scholarships are not valid in conjunction with each other; only one University of Lincoln International Scholarship per Programme of Study will be applied.
- 1.7. Students who have been awarded sponsorship from an organisation, or government body, for the full amount of their tuition fees will not be eligible to receive a University of Lincoln International Scholarship, except in instances where the University of Lincoln has a formal agreement in place with the sponsor.
- 1.8. Students who are in receipt of a study loan from a government body or private organisation will be eligible to receive a University of Lincoln International Scholarship, subject to meeting the relevant scholarship criteria.
- 1.9. Students who are repeating a year of their Programme of Study will not be eligible to receive a University of Lincoln International Scholarship.
- 1.10 Students studying a two-year postgraduate taught programme will only be entitled to receive a University of Lincoln International Scholarship in the first year of their studies.
- 1.11 Students studying the MBChB Medicine Programme of Study will not be eligible to receive a University of Lincoln International Scholarship.

Disclaimer

- 2.1. University of Lincoln International Scholarships are awarded as tuition fee discounts and are non-transferable.
- 2.2. The University of Lincoln reserves the right to refuse the award of a scholarship if a student's qualification has not been obtained from an ECCTIS recognised institution.
- 2.3. The University of Lincoln reserves the right to withdraw a University of Lincoln International

Scholarship if a student is subsequently found to be ineligible after an award has been made.

2.4. The University of Lincoln reserves the right to amend the provision of University of Lincoln International Scholarships at any point and without notice.

2.5. All University of Lincoln International Scholarship decisions made by the University of Lincoln are final.

The Awarding of Scholarships

International Undergraduate Scholarship

- 3.1. The International Undergraduate Scholarship is worth £2,000 and will be applied as a tuition fee discount against each full-time year of study on an Undergraduate Programme whilst at the University of Lincoln. For the avoidance of doubt, students taking part in a work placement year, or study abroad placement, will not be eligible to receive the International Undergraduate Scholarship for that particular year.
- 3.2. To be eligible to receive the International Undergraduate Scholarship, students must have submitted their application to study at the University of Lincoln prior to the deadline of Monday 1 June 2026.
- 3.3. Students joining a Foundation Year or International Year One Programme at the University of Lincoln will be eligible to receive the International Undergraduate Scholarship when they continue to the first/second year of their undergraduate course.
- 3.4. Students who are eligible to study a full-time Undergraduate Programme at the University of Lincoln as an advanced entry student will qualify, subject to meeting the conditions of Clauses 3.1 and 3.2, for the International Undergraduate Scholarship for each year of their Undergraduate programme, with the exception of students from China, see Clause 3.5 below.
- 3.5. Advanced entry students from China joining a full-time Undergraduate Programme at the University of Lincoln will not be eligible to receive the International Undergraduate Scholarship. However, subject to meeting the relevant criteria specified in Clause 4 below, will be eligible to receive the China Advanced Entry Undergraduate Scholarship.

China Advanced Entry Undergraduate Scholarship

- 4.1. To be eligible to receive the China Advanced Entry Undergraduate Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) mainland China at the time of applying to the University.
- 4.2. The China Advanced Entry Undergraduate Scholarship is worth £1,000 and will be applied as a tuition fee discount against each full-time year of study on an Undergraduate Programme at the University of Lincoln, subject to meeting the conditions of Clause 4.3. For the avoidance of doubt, students taking part in a work placement year or study abroad placement, will not be eligible to receive the China Advanced Entry Undergraduate Scholarship for that particular year.
- 4.3. The China Advanced Entry Undergraduate Scholarship will be awarded to eligible students who are directly entering onto level 2, or level 3, of an Undergraduate Programme at the University of Lincoln. For the avoidance of doubt, students entering level 1 of an Undergraduate Programme will not be eligible to receive the scholarship.
- 4.4. Students must have submitted their application to study at the University of Lincoln before Monday

1 June 2026 in order to be eligible.

Africa Scholarship

- 5.1 To be eligible to receive the Africa Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) Africa at the time of applying to the University.
- 5.2 The Africa Scholarship will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 5.3 Students joining a Pre-Master's Programme at the University of Lincoln will be eligible to receive the Africa Scholarship when they move onto their main Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 5.4 A £5,000 Africa Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
- a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained at least the equivalent of a 2:1 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification as determined by the University
- 5.5 A £4,000 Africa Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
- a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained the equivalent of a 2:2 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification as determined by the University

Canada Scholarship

- 6.1. To be eligible to receive the Canada Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) Canada at the time of applying to the University.
- 6.2. The Canada Scholarship is worth £5,000 and will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 6.3. Students joining a Pre-Master's Programme at the University of Lincoln will be eligible to receive the Canada Scholarship when they move onto their main Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 6.4. The scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
- a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained at least the equivalent of a 2:1 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification as determined by the University

European Union/EEA Scholarship

- 7.1 To be eligible to receive the European Union/EEA Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) one of the following countries at the time of applying to the University: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, or Sweden.

- 7.2 The European Union/EEA Scholarship is worth £5,000 and will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 7.3 Students joining a Pre-Master's Programme at the University of Lincoln will be eligible to receive the European Union/EEA Scholarship when they move onto their main Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 7.4 The scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
- a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained at least the equivalent of a 2:1 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification

South Asia Scholarship

- 8.1 To be eligible to receive the South Asia Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) one of the following countries at the time of applying to the University: Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Pakistan, or Sri Lanka.
- 8.2 The South Asia Scholarship will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 8.3 Students joining a Pre-Master's Programme at the University of Lincoln will be eligible to receive the South Asia Scholarship when they move onto their main Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 8.4 A £5,000 South Asia Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
- a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained at least the equivalent of a 2:1 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification
- 8.5 A £3,000 South Asia Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
- a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained the equivalent of a 2:2 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification

South East Asia Scholarship

- 9.1 To be eligible to receive the South East Asia Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) one of the following countries at the time of applying to the University: Brunei, Cambodia, East Timor, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, or Vietnam.
- 9.2 The South East Asia Scholarship will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 9.3 Students joining a Pre-Master's Programme at the University of Lincoln will be eligible to receive the South East Asia Scholarship when they move onto their main Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 9.4 A £5,000 South East Asia Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:

- a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained at least the equivalent of a 2:1 classification **or**
- b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification

9.5 £4,000 South East Asia Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:

- a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained the equivalent of a 2:2 classification **or**
- b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification

Turkey Scholarship

10.1 To be eligible to receive the Turkey Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) Turkey at the time of applying to the University.

10.2 The Turkey Scholarship will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.

10.3 Students joining a Pre-Master's Programme at the University of Lincoln will be eligible to receive the Turkey Scholarship when they move onto their main Postgraduate Taught Programme.

10.4 A £5,000 Turkey Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:

- a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained at least the equivalent of a 2:1 classification **or**
- b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification

10.5 A £4,000 Turkey Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:

- a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained the equivalent of a 2:2 classification **or**
- b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification

Global Postgraduate Scholarship

11.1. The Global Postgraduate Scholarship is worth £2,000 and will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.

11.2. Students joining a Pre-Master's Programme at the University of Lincoln will be eligible to receive the Global Postgraduate Scholarship when they move onto their main Postgraduate Taught Programme.

11.3. The scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have met the University of Lincoln's entry criteria for their chosen programme.

Global Leaders Scholarship

12.1 The Global Leaders Scholarship is worth 50% of tuition fees for one year of study at the University of Lincoln. For the avoidance of doubt, students studying a Programme of Study with a duration of two or

more years will only be entitled to receive the scholarship during the first year of enrolment at the University.

12.2 To be eligible to apply for the Global Leaders Scholarship, students must have a conditional offer or unconditional offer of a place on an Undergraduate Programme, or Postgraduate Taught Programme, commencing at the University in the 2026/27 academic year.

12.3 The Global Leaders Scholarship is competitive. In order to be considered for the scholarship, students must submit a University of Lincoln Global Leaders Scholarship Application form prior to one of the deadlines listed below:

For a Programme of Study commencing in September 2026:

Round One: Monday 6 April 2026

Round Two: Monday 1 June 2026

For a Programme of Study commencing in January 2027:

Round One: Monday 16 November 2026

12.4 University of Lincoln Global Leaders Scholarship Application forms received after the deadline will be considered at the next applicable application round. Applications received after the final deadline will not be considered.

12.5 Students intending to join an Undergraduate Degree are expected to achieve a minimum of 128 UCAS points (or an equivalent) in their High School studies. Students who are in the process of completing their studies at the time of submitting a University of Lincoln Global Leaders Scholarship Application form will need to include a copy of their most recent academic transcripts as part of their application.

12.6 Students intending to join a Postgraduate Taught Programme must have obtained a minimum of a 2.1 classification or higher (or its equivalent) in their undergraduate degree. Students who are in the process of finishing their studies at the time of submitting a University of Lincoln Global Leaders Scholarship Application form will need to provide a copy of their most recent academic transcript as part of their application.

12.7 Students who have been awarded a Global Leaders Scholarship must choose to accept or decline the scholarship award, and pay a CAS deposit (where applicable), by the date specified in the award confirmation email/letter. The University reserves the right to withdraw the offer of a Global Leaders Scholarship if the acceptance and/or CAS deposit deadline has not been met.

12.8 The University endeavours to notify Global Leaders Scholarship applicants of a scholarship decision, via email, within 10 working days following the applicable round closing date.

International Alumni Scholarship

13.1 The International Alumni Scholarship is worth £2,000 and will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.

13.2 The scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have successfully completed a University of Lincoln Programme of Study.

Partner Scholarship

14.1 The Partner Scholarship is worth £5,000 of tuition fees for one year of study on an Undergraduate Programme. For the avoidance of doubt, students studying an Undergraduate Programme with a

duration of two or more years will only be entitled to receive the scholarship during the first year of their enrolment at the University.

- 14.2 To be eligible to apply for the Partner Scholarship, students must have previously studied at an overseas higher education provider which has a partnership with the University of Lincoln. Students must also be in receipt of a conditional or unconditional offer of a place, through advanced entry, on an Undergraduate Programme which commences at the University of Lincoln in September 2026.
- 14.3 The Partner Scholarship is competitive. In order to be considered for the scholarship, students must submit a University of Lincoln Partner Scholarship Application form before the deadline of Monday 1 June 2026. Applications received after the deadline will not be considered.
- 14.4 To be eligible to receive the scholarship, students must have obtained a minimum of a 2.1 classification or higher (or its equivalent) in their undergraduate studies. Students who are in the process of finishing their studies at the time of submitting a University of Lincoln Partner Scholarship Application Form will need to provide a copy of their most recent academic transcript as part of their application.
- 14.5 Students who have been awarded a Partner Scholarship must choose to accept or decline the scholarship award and pay a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) deposit (where applicable), by the date specified in the award confirmation email/letter. The University reserves the right to withdraw the offer of a Partner Scholarship if the acceptance and/or CAS deposit deadline has not been met.
- 14.6 The University endeavours to notify Partner Scholarship applicants of a scholarship decision, via email, within 10 working days following the application deadline.
