Practice Education 1

The Practice Education 1 Module can be studied as a 'stand alone' module or as part of the Masters award. It meets the requirements of stage 1 of the Practice Education Framework and carries 30 Masters Credits. At Masters Level the pass mark for all assessed work is 50%. The module invites students to explore the theoretical underpinning of practice education and to use their developing knowledge to reflect on their own practice in promoting and assessing student learning.

Where students are undertaking the Practice Educator module within the MSc Advanced Professional Practice in Social Work programme there will already have been opportunity to return to academic reading and writing skills through modules such as Consolidation. Many people however do successfully elect to come to the module without this prior experience. Therefore, in order to both support your return to academic studies and to enable the University to assess your ability to study at Masters Level, we ask that applicants undertake a short written piece prior to their entry onto the course.

Written Task

You are asked to produce a 1,000 word exploration of the following:

Explore the ways that you have used reflection and reflective practice to promote student learning.

Guidance

- In undertaking this task we expect that you draw on background reading to support your discussions (for example, Knott, C and Scragg, T (2009) *Reflective Practice in Social Work* Exeter: Learning Matters).
- A reference list should be provided at the end of your work.
- You are advised to consider any materials or tools you have used to promote students' reflection on practice.
- You could also consider any materials and tools you have used when promoting reflection of learning with a newly qualified social worker.
